Application for MFA Teaching Fellowship

The MFA Teaching Fellowship is a two-year appointment that trains a select number of students for a career in teaching. Teaching fellows serve in their first year as interns, attending and assisting with an undergraduate composition course. Fellows are matched with an experienced professor and meet regularly with the director of the Composition Program to discuss readings in pedagogy and your classroom experiences. After completion of the internship and coursework, fellows then teach a composition course in their second year. The fellowship pays a stipend of \$2000 in the first year, and roughly \$5000 in the second.
