**CITY INFORMATION**

London is not just a capital city — the center of the British politics and government — it is also one of the great world cities — an international center for business, culture and the arts. It is a melting pot known for its theater, entertainment, fashion, history, pubs, museums and markets. Despite its size, it is also a series of small villages with beautiful squares, hidden gardens, and local parks making it one of the greenest capital cities in the world.

**UNIVERSITY INFORMATION**

Queen Mary University of London is situated in the heart of the East End, an area of London with a rich past, but also one which has become one of the capital's most vibrant and exciting areas. The main campus building is an imposing white stone edifice dating from 1887, but the sixteen-acre site now consists mainly of modern purpose-built buildings which houses faculty and administrative offices, the Great Hall, a new library, the Informatics Teaching Laboratory, three restaurants, a cafe-bar, bank, bookshop, health center, students residences and the Students' Union Building. The university has a combined undergraduate and graduate student body of 13,000 and has an international reputation for quality, achievement and success.

**THE EAST END OF LONDON**

The East End of London is an area rich in history and cultural diversity. Due to its position on the River Thames, it was the working heart of the city, largely providing housing and work places for working class Londoners—the original cockneys. The industries have moved out and the area now provides housing, shopping and entertainment to a diverse population.

There are delightful contrasts to be found here in the bustle of street markets, peaceful walks along the Regent's Canal and through Victoria Park, ethnic cafes and restaurants, traditional pubs, museums and art galleries. Although one of London's oldest areas, it also contains the ultra-modern Docklands development which boast some of Europe's most modern architecture. Nearby Brick Lane is famous for its eclectic market, curry houses and 24-hour bagel shops and is also now home to a growing number of artists and designers.

**HOUSING**
