## Editor's Year in Review

Congratulations for your excellent teaching and your most productive year as scholars. With the new faculty profile capabilities, we can capture annually your scholarly accomplishments and share them with the SMC community. (See the attached listing.) This year was a banner year for the number of books, articles, presentations and productions. Many of you celebrated your work at the Scholars Reception, hosted by the Provost Beth Dobkin, Dean of Academic Resources Tom Carter and School Deans Woolpert, Jersky and Allen.

### ***BOS Faculty Professional Development Strategic Plan***

The Committee on Teaching and Scholarship, the Faculty Fund Committee and the Faculty Welfare Committee created a Faculty Professional Development Strategic Plan based on the assessment of faculty needs with an on-line survey as well as studies of faculty fund and sabbatical usage over a ten-year period. This BOS report, submitted November 1, called for increased funding for faculty scholarship and for faculty services of mentoring, coaching for teaching and learning our diverse student body as well as continuing support in technology and library resources.

The President, Cabinet and Budget committee acted quickly and decisively to support additional faculty needs. Faculty Fellows were funded and Faculty Development Funds were increased as follows:

### ***Faculty Scholarship Awards Increased!***

#### **AY 2008-9**

- Tenured faculty from \$1,600 max to \$1,800
- Pre-tenured faculty from \$1,600 max to \$2,000
- Adjunct \$900

#### **AY 2009-10**

- Tenured faculty from \$1,800 to \$1,900
- Pre-tenured \$2,000
- Adjunct \$900

#### **AY 2010-11**

- All tenured and pre-tenured faculty \$2,000
- Adjunct \$900

This fall, Nancy Clark and I attended the Professional Organizational Development (POD) conference, the national faculty development organization. We networked with other institutions and learned that we are wonderfully resourced in the area of faculty scholarship. Regular sabbaticals, faculty research awards, as well as resources for curricular development are strong indicators of SMC's commitment to faculty.

### ***Faculty Fellows Program Launched***

Mobilizing expertise within one's institutions was among the most cited best practices for enhancing faculty effectiveness at the POD conference. The faculty fellow model was piloted this year with Chair Development and will continue in 2008-09 with mentoring across the career arc; coaching for teaching with inclusive excellence; supporting instructional technology (CaTS and FTG); and Scholarship of Teaching & Learning (SoTL). The Faculty Fellows for AY 2008-9 will be Dana Herrera, Anna Novakov, Becky Proehl, Myrna Santiago, Sally Stampf, Jeff Sigman and Ed Tywoniak.

### ***Some Highlights of AY 2007-2008:***

Woodrow Wilson Fellow Robert Musil, spokesman on environmental and social issues, spent the week of Feb. 24 on campus visiting classes, interacting with faculty and students, advocating grass roots movements and persuading students that they can make a difference! Faculty reporting on sabbatical research covered topics ranging from Estonia's Economic Challenge by Norm Bedford to Nicaragua's Earthquake by Myrna Santiago.

This year's SoTL cohort, led by Anna Novakov, included Valerie Burke, Dan Leopard, Adam Lucas, Tomas Gomez, Maria Ruiz and Michelle Shulman examining their teaching. David Rasch, Stanford ombudsperson, discussed the role of the ombudsman in promoting Civil Discourse. Proactive hiring was discussed in Chair orientation sessions, and the annual R&T workshop provided practical help for pre-tenure faculty.

Faculty/student collaborative research projects were supported and the Grants Office team of Elizabeth Gallagher, Kathleen Cook, Carol Anderson and Marilyn Terstegge provided faculty with grant seeking guidance.
