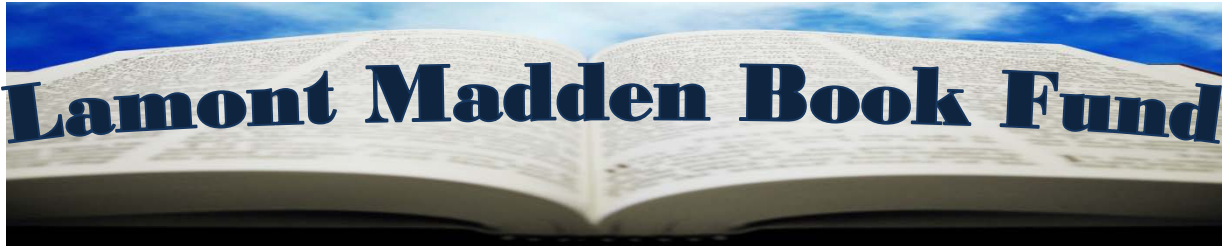


LAMONT MADDEN BOOK FUND COLLEGIATE SEMINAR SUPPORT PROGRAM APPLICATION

2. Letter

- ◆ Login to GaelXpress. On the left side of the Student Page, find the heading Financial Aid. Under that heading, click on financial aid award letter. Select the current year from the drop down menu and submit. Print the letter and attach it to your application.

3. Community Service Project

All students who receive Lamont Madden Book Fund are required to participate in one service project each semester you borrow from the fund. We suggest either the **LEO Center** or **De Marillac Academy**. It is YOUR responsibility to contact CILSA and complete your service project expectations by the end of the semester.

Students who DO NOT complete a service project will be charged a \$100 rental fee to their SMC account.

De Marillac Academy:

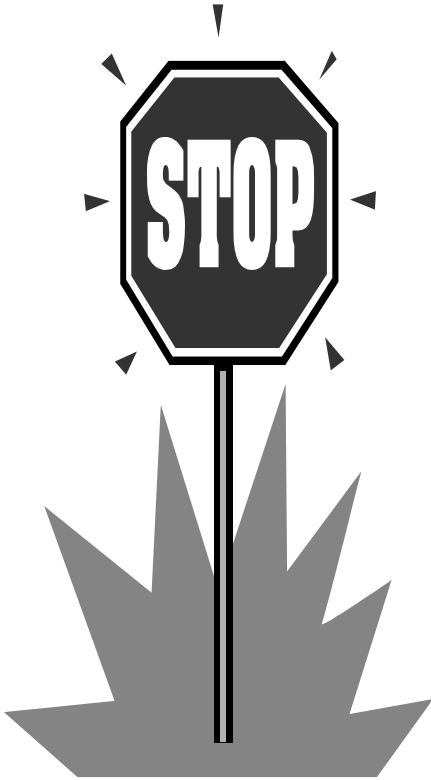
