### **Position Title: Postdoctoral Psychology Resident**

#### **Background**

Founded in 1863, Saint Mary's is a residential campus nestled 20 miles east of San Francisco in the picturesque Moraga Valley. Based in the Catholic, Lasallian and Liberal Arts traditions, Saint Mary's currently enrolls more than 4,000 students from diverse backgrounds in undergraduate and graduate programs. The De La Salle Christian Brothers, the largest teaching order of the Roman Catholic Church, guide the spiritual and academic character of the College.

#### **Position Description and Job Duties**

Performs supervised individual and group counseling, supervision, crisis intervention, programming, and consultation/outreach to the College community.

Provides brief therapy, Single session therapy, and makes appropriate referrals.

Work is supervised by professional staff, and individual clinical work is supervised by a licensed psychologist.

This is a 9.5 month, 42.5 hour/week position.

#### **Required Qualifications**

- Earned a doctoral degree (Ph.D. or Psy.D.) from a regionally or APA-accredited Counseling or Clinical Psychology program.
- Completion of a doctoral psychology internship that included counseling/psychotherapy as a main component of the training program.

#### **Preferred Qualifications**

- Prior experience working with developmental issues of late adolescence, college students, and with diverse populations.
- Completion of doctoral psychology internship at a university counseling center.
- Prior experience working with "high-risk" clients (e.g., emotional dysregulation, suicidality, substance use, self-harm).

- Familiarity with Psychodynamic/relational theory and technique.
- Knowledge and experience in sports psychology and working with student athletes strongly encouraged to apply.

**Essential Duties and Responsibilities:**

- Conducts intake interviews with students who request counseling services and completes the required clinical documentation via electronic recordkeeping system within the same day.
- Provides individual and group counseling to students on a scheduled basis or through crisis intervention.
- Periodically serve as an “on-call” counselor after-hours, conduct risk- and safety-assessments, and respond as needed.
- Provides clinical supervision to a practicum student and maintains supervision notes.
- Provides outreach workshops to the campus community.
- Consults with supervisors and staff as needed.
- Acts as a campus resource regarding mental health issues and represents CAPS on campus.
- Serves as a liaison between client and campus or community resources as needed.
- Provides consultation to staff, faculty, and parents seeking assistance for distressed students or those with serious mental health issues.
- Attends all required training seminars, staff meetings, and supervision on a weekly basis.
- Interacts with staff and students in a professional and ethical manner.
- Participates in supervision and training with an openness to learning and receiving feedback.

**Required Hours:** Postdocs will work 4 days a week in 10 hour shifts either Monday through Thursday, or Tuesday through Friday excluding national and/or campus holidays.

**Salary and Benefits:** \$49,500/year plus benefits (i.e., sick time, accrued vacation time, and options for health, dental, and vision insurance).

**Start Date:** August 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023 - Orientation takes place during the first two weeks. **Orientation is mandatory and takes place Monday through Friday 9am-5pm from 8/14-8/25.** Normal hours begin on August 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Postdoc year ends May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

3. Three letters of recommendation. (1 letter from a clinical supervisor from your predoctoral internship, 1 letter from either clinical or administrative supervisor, and 1 letter from your dissertation chair outlining a timeline for completion of dissertation and graduation date).
4. Transcripts of graduate work, unofficial is acceptable.
