

The minor in Japanese Studies gives students language skills and cultural competencies for traveling and working in Japan.

The following lower-division courses are required for the minor unless students place directly into JAPAN 201 or higher.

JAPAN 101 Beginning Japanese (4CU) JAPAN 102 Continuing Beginning Japanese (4CU) CORE: Arts and Humanities JAPAN 201 Intermediate Japanese (4CU) CORE: Global Issues and Perspectives

One conversation course and one culture course are required, courses may be repeated.

JAPAN 110 (1CU) Basic Conversation or *JAPAN 310 (1CU) Intermediate/advanced Conversation JAPAN 120 (1CU) Introduction to Japanese Culture or *JAPAN 320 (1CU) Advanced Culture
