

# Saint Mary's College of California Institutional Fact Book Fall 2023

#### Overview

The Saint Mary's Fact Book contains basic information about various measures of student enrollment and outcomes. Typically, in each section several years' worth of data are reported.

The first section of the Fact Book contains data about student enrollment, student demographics, and number of declared majors by school and department.

• Fall enrollment and demographics are based on census day enrollment (basically a freeze of our enrollment data that takes place in mid-October). Demographic data are typically more complete for undergraduate students than for graduate students.

The second section of the Fact Book contains data about average class size by school and department.

The third section of the Fact Book contains data about student persistence, including fall-to-fall retention rates, and graduation rates.

- Retention and graduation rates are based on a cohort of either first-time students (typically incoming freshmen), or incoming transfer students. The Fact Book contains separate tables for each group, as we track somewhat different outcomes depending on admit status.
- Each cohort is tracked for a certain number of years to determine various persistence outcomes. As an example, in fall 2018 we admitted 624 first-time freshmen. These students were followed to fall 2019 to determine the fall-to-fall retention rate. Over a longer term, these same students were tracked through summer 2022 to determine their 4-year graduation rate. For more recent cohorts (e.g. fall 2021) less data is available, since the students have not been enrolled long enough to determine graduation rates.
- Transfer students are tracked in a similar manner, but with somewhat different outcomes. For example, it is possible (and common) for transfer students to graduate within 2 or 3 years after matriculating, since they bring in a certain number of credit hours (sometimes quite high). So we look at graduation rates over a shorter period of time compared to first-time students.

The fourth and final section of the Fact Book shows the number of degrees awarded for each of the past five academic years. These data include all graduates within this time frame, regardless of when they began or what cohort they belonged to. Note that occasionally the same student can receive two degrees (e.g. BA and BS) in the same year, so these students would be counted twice.
