



Locker Occupancy Policy

Joseph L. Alioto Recreation Center

Locker Occupancy is defined as the locker in the Student or Faculty/staff Locker Room assigned to the registered user. This user is authorized to secure personal items year-round. Day-use lockers do not need to be registered.

Users are responsible for removing items upon request, either semesterly or annually for deep cleaning. Items not removed prior to cleaning will be placed in lost and found, and a lock may be cut if necessary.

- Student locker rooms are designated for SMC Student use and the Faculty & Staff Locker Room is designated for SMC professional employees & affiliate member use. Student Employees are considered students and are asked to use the student locker room.
- Day-use Lockers are also available and defined as utilizing the locker during the time in which you are present in the Joseph L. Alioto Recreation Center and/or participating in Campus Recreation activities for the day. Day-use lockers must be cleaned out at closing.
- If the locker is not properly registered, locks will be cut off, and personal belongings will be considered lost and found.
- Locker Occupancy requires registration through the provided link.
- Campus Recreation does not provide members with locks for lockers.
- SMC Campus Recreation is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged belongings.
- If given reason, Campus Safety may access lockers.
- All locker occupancy registration must be for the current academic year for members of the Joseph L Alioto Recreation Center. If membership is canceled or not continued for any reason, the locker occupancy is automatically canceled.
- SMC Students are not permitted to occupy lockers in the Faculty and Staff Locker Room.
- Locker Occupancy is not permitted in the Single-Use Locker Room.
- ADA Locker Occupancy is only available for those requiring ADA access.
- Double-capacity lockers in the faculty/staff locker room are not available for registration. They are reserved for day use only.
- Use of a locker by a person or persons other than those to whom it is issued is prohibited. Sharing rental lockers compromises security by allowing another member access to the locker.
- Do not hang swimsuits or other wet materials from locks, as this will damage the locker surface.
- No food or beverages other than water are to be stored in the rented locker. Glass containers are strongly discouraged.
 - If there is evidence of rodent or insect infestation, Campus Recreation reserves the right to remove and empty the locker.
