Later this fall, Staff Council and the Human Resources Department will launch a new staff recognition program that will award five staff members



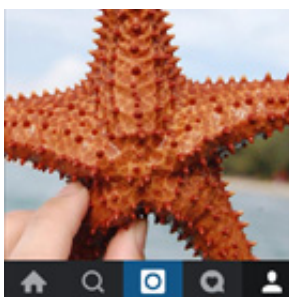
