



## Global and Regional Studies Major

Students first select between one of two tracks in the major: Global Studies or Regional Studies. Students in the Regional Studies track must select a specific region of the world in which they have a particular interest and wish to focus their studies – East Asia, Europe, Latin America, or student defined. The following Diablo Valley College courses are currently being accepted as fulfilling lower division major requirements for both tracks.

A transfer student must present a record with a minimum of 23 transferable semester units and a minimum GPA of 2.0 for admission to Saint Mary's College. To transfer with junior status a student should have 60 or more transferable units. All courses must be passed with a grade of "C-" or higher to be considered transferable. Students at Saint Mary's College of California are required to complete a minimum of 36 course credits (Approximately 120 semester units) toward a Bachelor's Degree. California Community College credits are accepted at the rate of 30 semester units = 45 quarter units = (9 COURSE CREDITS).
