



Justice, Community and Leadership Major

The mission of Justice, Community and Leadership is to prepare students through a social justice framework to be leaders who address critical challenges of our times. Justice, Community and Leadership is an interdisciplinary program that emphasizes critical inquiry, global perspectives, ethical ideals, social and environmental stewardship, leadership, education, and self-assessment. Along with the general major in Justice, Community and Leadership, there are three concentrations that students may pursue. All students complete the JCL common curriculum, and each concentration requires additional courses. Students also meet the general Core Curriculum requirements (see DVC Core Curriculum articulation agreement). The following Diablo Valley College courses are currently being accepted as fulfilling lower division major requirements.

A transfer student must present a record with a minimum of 23 transferable semester units and a minimum GPA of 2.0 for admission to Saint Mary's College. To transfer with junior status a student should have 60 or more transferable units. All courses must be passed with a grade of "C-" or higher to be considered transferable. Students at Saint Mary's College of California are required to complete a minimum of 36 course credits (Approximately 120 semester units) toward a Bachelor's Degree. California Community College credits are accepted at the rate of 30 semester units = 45 quarter units = (9 COURSE CREDITS).
