

How easy is it to incorporate Gender Inclusive Language into your life?

- ❑ Use alternating pronouns (he, she, they) when writing to make your work accessible to a wider range of readers
- ❑ When working with mixed gendered groups use inclusive phrases by replacing **he/she** with **they/them/theirs**
- ❑ Example: “Hey **Everyone**” instead of “Hey **guys**”
- ❑ Example: “Each employee will grab **their** marker” vs. “Each employee will grab **his** marker”

Things to Consider:

- ❑ Society has normalized gendered language
- ❑ Recognize where/when you use gendered language
- ❑ Practice gender inclusive options instead

Changing your language to be inclusive in everyday life will create a safer and more accepting community that welcomes all people

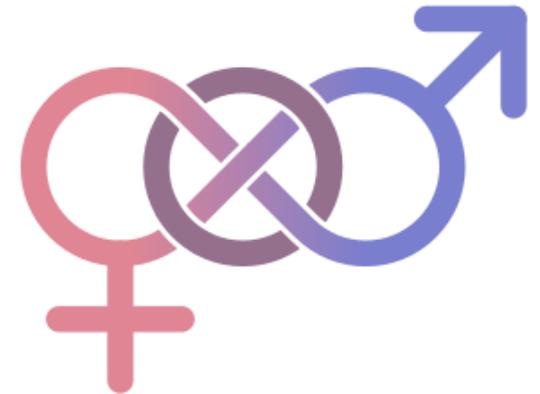

Using gender inclusive language creates a safer, more accepting environment for all people.

What is Gender Inclusive Language?

How does it help society?

- ❑ All gender identities are kept neutral
- ❑ Contains no gender and no sex based biases
- ❑ Eliminates social biases created by gendered language

What are Gender Neutral Pronouns?

Why are they important?

- ❑ Cisgender individuals (*people who identify with their biological sex*) may **not** think about pronouns ; may **not** recognize that people identify differently than their assigned biological sex
- ❑ For those who do **not** identify within a gender binary, gendered language can cause discomfort
- ❑ Assuming someone's gender can be hurtful- **ASK FOR THEIR GENDER PRONOUNS**

Pronouns

Possible Pronouns of Choice:

They, Them, Theirs

She, Her, Hers

He, Him, His

Ze, Hir, Hirs

Xe, Xem, Xyrs

Gender neutral pronouns are in color

Understanding Gendered Language

- ❑ Gendered language is used by the majority of people and it tends to favor a specific gender and excludes the rest of the population
- ❑ Gendered language **favours** males and **excludes** women and non-binary persons

Examples:

Gender Inclusive Language

"You Guys"

"Everyone"

"Freshman"

"First Year"

"Man" used as a gender default

"Individual" or "Person"

"Mankind"

"Humankind"

"Mail man"

"Postal Worker"

"Policeman"

"Police Officer"

"Cameraman"

"Camera Operator"

"Countryman"

"Compatriot"

These are only a few examples of how gender can be made inclusive in society
