The Coordinator of Sexual Assault Awareness, Outreach & Education (925) 631-4193

The Coordinator is a confidential resource, advocate and support person. Students can seek assistance, resources and information from the Coordinator without initiating the reporting process.

Counseling and Psychological Services

(925) 631-4364

Licensed therapists are available to help students who experience a wide variety of personal, academic and relationship concerns in a safe and confidential environment. Counselors with expertise in sexual assault are available. Students can access both individual counseling and a sexual trauma survivor's group.

Campus Assault Resources and Empowerment (CARE) Line—24 hour anonymous support

Students can utilize the line anonymously in order to get support, gather resources, learn their options for accessing medical and emotional care, and to receive critical, time-sensitive information about how to report their case on and off campus.

Women's Resource Center (925) 631-4192

The WRC is an inclusive space where every member of the SMC community can seek education, support, dialogue and engagement around issues of gender equity, identity and equality.

Mission and Ministry Center (925) 631-4366

Pastoral support and counseling is available. Priests are able to maintain confidentiality but other staff members are not.

Reporting and Disciplinary Resources

Office of Community Life (925) 631-4238

Available for consultation and assistance with the pursuit of possible disciplinary actions. Consulting with this office will not require you to file a report. Students may be accompanied by an advocate or advisor.

Public Safety (925) 631-4282

24/7 security, safety, crime prevention and emergency services at SMC. Officers are trained to respond appropriately to survivors of sexual assault. Reports can be made by phone or in person at any time.

Title IX Coordinator and Deputy Coordinators

These individuals provide support and information regarding options including: grievance procedures, interim remedies (such as change of academic, living or work situations) and ongoing emotional support to students, staff and faculty. They will assist in eliminating the misconduct, preventing its occurrence and addressing its effects.

Moraga Police Department (925) 376-2515

24/7 law enforcement agency with jurisdiction on campus. Officers can come onto campus to take a report and can assist with getting medical attention for a survivor. Law enforcement is responsible for setting up a forensic medical exam. An advocate can be present at all interactions with law enforcement to support the survivor.

Physical Health and Evidence Collection

Health and Wellness Center (925) 631-4254

Clinicians provide basic medical and urgent care for minor injuries. For serious injuries, students are assessed and then referred to hospitals and physicians in the community. STI tests are provided.

Note: Under certain circumstances, health care professionals are required by law to report injuries that appear to have been suffered through assaultive or abusive conduct to the police.

Contra Costa Regional Medical Center

(925) 370-5000

Forensic medical exams are performed by specially trained nurses who collect evidence, treat injuries and provide prophylactic treatment for STIs and pregnancy. Law enforcement should be contacted before going to the hospital for the exam. An advocate can be present at the medical exam to support the survivor.

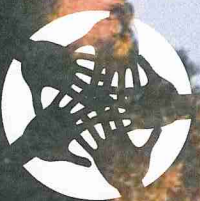
Student Engagement and Academic Success
