2. Updates

(a) Ranked Teaching in Jan Term and Seminar

Jim Met with Executive Committee of the Academic Senate 1/29. The Senate will meet in closed session sometime in February to determine whether this will appear on an open session agenda.

(b) Designation Renewal

First discussed by UEPC in September. At their October meeting they kinda decided to make a counter proposal. That's where the situations sits.

Given the slow pace of progress (and Jim's desire that the Senate not put this on the consent agenda) Jim thinks it unlikely that we will have a Renewal process in place for next year. What now?

(c) LEAP & BALOS

BALOS is done. (They are still in discussion with AARC about necessary courses.)

LEAP had their Feb 1st deadline pushed to March 1st. There are still some issues.

(d) CLEP Exams

The college allows undergraduate students to gain credits via CLEP subject exams. It does not allow TUG students to use the CLEP general exams for this. Traditionally BALOS students have been allowed to the general exams for satisfying the Area Requirements, but not for credit. What to do now?

BALOS would be interested in allowing their students to satisfy the Artistic Analysis, SHCU and Scientific Understanding requirements via the Humanities, Social Science and History, and Natural Science (rest.) exams. (CLEP indicates that each exam is equivalent to two semester's worth of content.) Jim said No, CCC is bound by the Catalog, and this is an AARC question. BALOS responded they didn't want to go to AARC unless they had some confidence the effort was worth it.

Question: Do we wish to decide that these exams can be used to satisfy Core requirements? Are there repercussions?

(e) Integral Program

The Provost accepted the December 10th Senate recommendation waiving Core requirements for students in the classes of 2016 and 2017, excepting Community Engagement. Senate is still in discussion with Provost on responding to her rejection of their recommendation that Integral be outside of the Core. Our conversation with Integral is in hiatus awaiting the conclusions.

(f) Language Requirement and the Core Curriculum

Jim and Elena are meeting with the language folks on February 16th.

(g) Designations Update

About 75 proposals considered. Most were designated.
