Position Purpose

The Vice President for Student Life Student Advisory Board is a group of students (20) comprised of undergraduate and graduate students reflecting the diversity of our campus, who will meet regularly with the Vice President for Student Life to discuss new initiatives and emergent issues. Student Government (ASSMC) will be represented on this board and will work closely with the board to address student concerns. This advisory board will be charged with providing deliberate input regarding out-of-classroom experiences, thoughts, ideas, concerns, and suggestions on improving student success and student life, emphasizing minoritized, underserved, and underrepresented students.

Responsibilities

The advisory board meets at least monthly with Student Affairs administrators and other College leaders to discuss various issues related to the campus. The Vice President hosts the meetings for Student Life who requests input, opinions, and recommendations from student members who express different aspects of student interest. It is expected that the Vice President for Student Life Student Advisory Board members are well-informed on issues at the university. They communicate with other students before and after meetings to gauge and convey campus-wide student opinions. These students may also be invited to represent and serve the College in various other capacities to enhance Student life.

Eligibility

Students must be enrolled in classes at SMC during the term of service on the Board and be in good standing (academic and judicial). Exceptions to eligibility are at the discretion of the Vice President for Student Life.

The Vice President will appoint board members for Student Life through an application process. Applicants should demonstrate a commitment to student interests and a willingness to work with campus leadership to enhance the student experience. Priority will be given to students who demonstrate their ability to represent multiple identities, perspectives, life experiences, and roles at the College.
