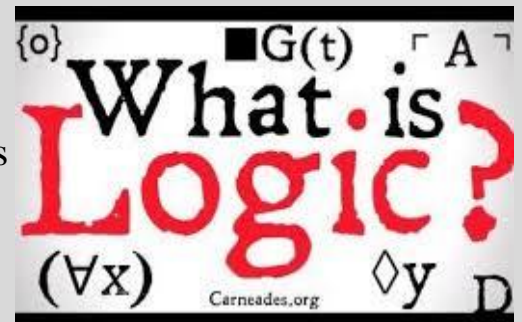

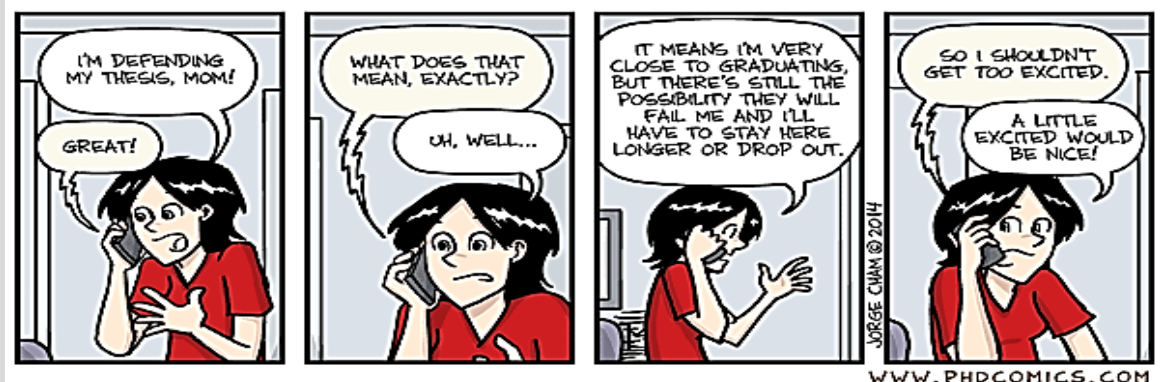
A study, through close reading, discussing and writing, of "metaphysical" texts of Rene Descartes, Immanuel Kant and G.W.F. Hegel
